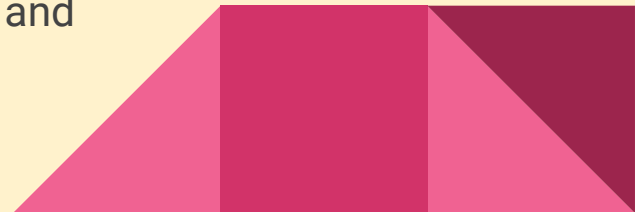

# Sealy ISD COVID Plan Requirements

- ❖ Public review of the plan and any changes every six months
  - universal and correct wearing of masks;
  - modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing;
  - handwashing and respiratory etiquette;
  - cleaning and maintaining facilities;
  - including improving ventilation;
  - contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine;
  - diagnostic and screening testing;
  - efforts to provide vaccinations to school;
  - appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies;
  - coordination with State and local health officials; and
  - ensuring continuity of services.



# Plan Updates

- ❖ Basic cleaning and hygiene protocols are still in place
  - ❖ Changes to quarantine and return for a COVID-19 positive individual
    - Quarantine for 5 full days
    - If 24 hours symptom and fever-free, may return
    - If not, additional quarantine (5 days), testing or alternate diagnosis will be required in order to return
  - ❖ No longer requiring quarantine for close contacts, unless symptoms develop
  - ❖ Person with symptoms will quarantine until 24 hours symptom-free

# Plan Updates (cont.)

- ❖ Notification
  - No daily posting of cases at this time
  
- ❖ Testing
  - COVID Clinic is closed
  - Nurses will keep tests in their campus clinics for:
    - Staff and staff children
    - Sick students being sent home at parent request

# ESSER Spending Update

## Entitlements and Dates

### ESSER I (CARES Act):

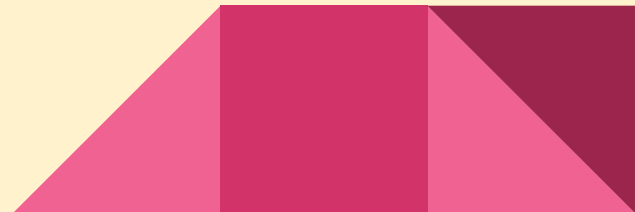
- \$418,550
- March 13, 2020 - September 20, 2022

### ESSER II (CRRSA Act):

- \$1,683,216
- March 13, 2020 - September 20, 2023

### ESSER III (ARP Act):

- \$3,781,485 (20% directly to learning loss: \$756,297)
- March 13-2020 - September 20, 2024



# ESSER Spending Requirements

\***ESSER I**: The statutory intent and purpose of the CARES Act education funding is to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus.

\***ESSER III**: The statutory intent and purpose of the CRRSA Act is to add additional stimulus funding to be available to LEAs to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus.

\***ESSER II**: The statutory intent and purpose of the ARP Act is to provide wrap-around services in light of the challenges of COVID-19; and assistance needed to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities.

- Chromebooks: \$12,339
