



# Sealy ISD Remote Learning Grading Guidelines

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## **Grading for Individual/Weekly Assignments**

Grades will be evenly spread throughout the 4th Nine-weeks. The grades will all have an equal weight (all assignments count the same towards the final average).

6 grades will be collected for the 4th Nine-weeks

Students earning a 70% or higher will receive a P on their report card and transcript for the 4th nine-weeks. Students that earn below 70% will receive an "I" on their report card (and high school transcript) for the 4th nine-weeks.

## **4th Nine-weeks Final Average (Pass/Incomplete)**

Participation and completion of remote learning assignments are required and will result in a grade of **Pass (P)** for the 4th nine-weeks.

Lack of participation and/or lack of completion of remote learning assignments will result in a grade of **Incomplete (I)** for the 4th Nine-weeks. Students receiving an incomplete for the second semester could be required to attend summer school.

## **2nd Semester (Spring) Final Average (Pass/Incomplete)**

Determination of **Pass/Incomplete** for the 2nd Semester (Spring 2019-2020) will include consideration of students' work completed during the period of on-site instruction (3rd Nine-weeks) in addition to remote learning progress.

## **Secondary Specific Guidelines**

Dual Credit students will receive a letter grade from the college and a **Pass/Incomplete** for the high school course.

Advanced Placement students will receive a **Pass/Incomplete** for their high school course and still be able to take the AP test.

Teachers will work individually with students who were unsuccessful in the first semester or 3rd nine-weeks to achieve passing averages.

### **Progress Reporting to Parents**

Teachers will communicate with students/parents if participation concerns are evident (email, phone call, Google Classroom, etc.)

Please contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns regarding the academic performance or need additional support.

### **Promotion**

Decisions on promoting to the next grade will be based on student's performance for the entire 2019-2020 school year and will take into consideration the extraordinary circumstances of the school closure. (High school students must earn the appropriate number of credits, as always, for promotion)

Sealy ISD will keep the best interests of the students at the center of every decision regarding promotion.
